"CHOOSE YOUR INSPIRATION" Magazine Challenge

Now that the busy holiday season is over, and the stormy winter days are here, it's a great time to stay in and sew. Why not make a Challenge quilt? Just pick any magazine (other than a quilt magazine) and check out pages 11, 22 and 33. Surely you will find something there to spark your creativity and turn your idea into a quilt. If not, feel free to choose a different magazine and try again. Let your imagination be your guide. Here's a reminder of the guidelines:

- Each participant must submit a copy of their magazine page, along with a written explanation of how their page inspired their quilt.
- The total perimeter of the quilt must be **less than or equal** to 144 inches, (*for example 36 X 36"*)
- Any technique or combination of techniques are allowed.
- The quilt must be quilted.
- The quilt must be made of fabric, but non-fabric embellishments are okay.
- Have some fun!

At the March Meeting, all Block of the Month Participants will receive the final installment of instructions to complete their Block of the Month Quilt Tops. The instructions for sashing and borders will be included. The layout of the blocks is totally up to you. There is no special order; do whatever looks most pleasing to you. Borders such as inner and outer borders can be as the pattern shows or you can use your own creativity. Please bring your completed top to the April Meeting! Everyone that brings a completed top to the April meeting will have a chance to have their quilt top quilted by me! You must also have your backing prepared! (backings need to be five inches bigger than the quilt top on each side). We will draw one name and the lucky winner will have their top quilted. Not to worry, though. Our wonderful, generous volunteers keep the quilts coming in, up to 50 a day. So the shelves are looking better. (We do like to have a couple hundred on hand for emergencies.)

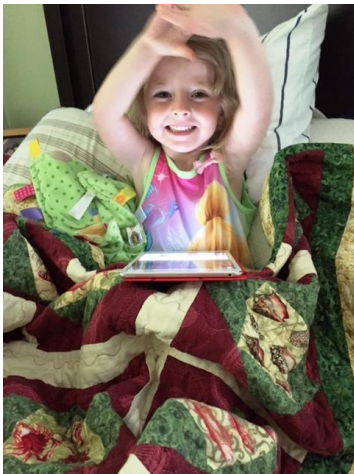
Our goal this year is to keep the quilt room almost empty. In the month of January, 2019, alone we shipped or delivered **796** quilts!

And now, a few more numbers...

In order for us to maintain our non-profit status, one thing we have to do is keep track of every kit that goes out, every quilt that comes in and every quilt that is donated to children all over the country, in hospitals, shelters, temporary housing because of flood and fire, foster care and Habitat homes.

We are very proud of the 2018 total.

Including Headquarters and our 92 chapters, last year we comforted at least **21,371** children and their families.



Note from the Editor: I know this article may have been a little long, but I thought it was important to see just where and why the hours that you have spent sewing, quilting and putting on bindings is important. We don't often get to see what the hard work and time means to the ones that receive these quilts. The smiles on these children's faces is a big hug to all of you.

MAKING A SLEEVE

Cut fabric for sleeve 9" x the width of your quilt.

Fold the 9" ends under twice and sew close to the folded edge.

Fold sleeve in half lengthwise, wrong sides together, and press. This press line will be a guide only.

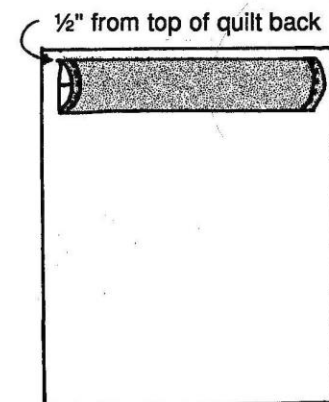
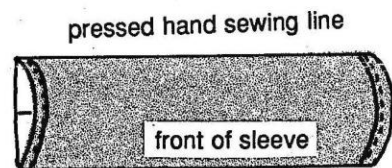
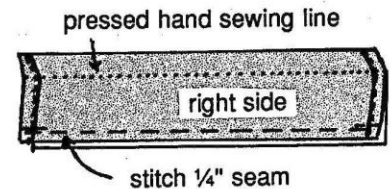
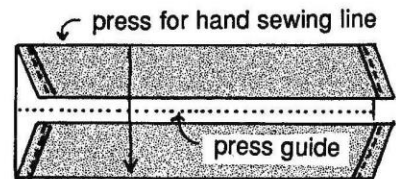
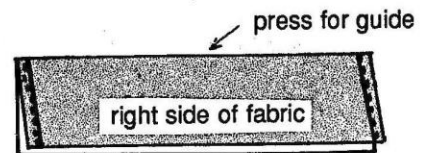
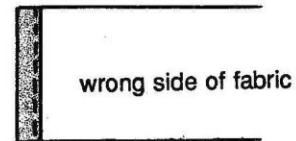
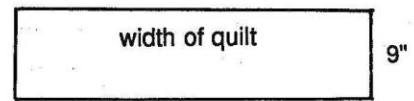
Open sleeve and fold the edges to the middle press line, wrong sides together. Press these new lines in firmly. They will be your hand sewing lines.

With wrong sides together, sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam the length of the sleeve. Begin the seam about $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the end, backstitch, continue seam to the end, then backstitch. This prevents the tails of thread from hanging out the ends of the sleeve.

Press the seam to one side, taking care not to press over the previous pressed edges. The sleeve will be convex on the side without the seam.

Pin sleeve along pressed edges to the quilt back. The top of the sleeve should be about $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the top of the quilt. Hand sew, being careful not to stitch through to the quilt front.
