New Block(s) of Month Challenge for the coming year!

Karen Ivas has a new projects for us. See the following patterns.

I will be sending instructions each month for two 10 inch blocks for a total of 16 blocks! **The sampler blocks can be made scrappy!**

Additional fabric requirements: 1-5/8 yards for sashing, and binding (1 yard for sashing and binding 5/8 yard for cornerstones).

Sashing, binding and cornerstones can be decided on after the blocks are completed.

In this newsletter you will find the instructions for the first two blocks. Enjoy a new project!

Shining Star Block

10" x 10" Finished

Materials

Fabrics listed are Confetti Cottons by Riley Blake

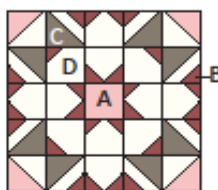
Frosting 6" x 9" (Copyright 2009)
 Marsala 3½" x WOF
 Pebble 4" x 21"
 Le Creme 6" x WOF

Tools

Marking pencil, scissors, ruler, rotary cutter and mat, iron and ironing board.

Cutting Instructions

Frosting: A- five 2½" squares
 Marsala: B- twenty eight 1½" squares
 Pebble: C- eight 2½" squares
 Le Creme: D- twenty four 2½" squares



Sewing Instructions

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of four of the B squares. Place one square, right sides together, on the corner of a D square as shown. Sew on the marked line, then trim the corner off, ¼" away from the seam. Press the seam towards the darker fabric. Make 4.



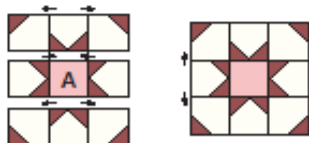
2. Repeat this step, sewing four more B squares on each of the Step 1 units as shown below.



3. Repeat Step 1 with four more B and D squares. Make 4.



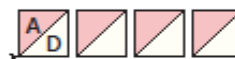
4. Assemble the center of the Shining Star block as shown below using the units in Steps 2 and 3, plus one A square. Sew each row together, then sew row 1 to row 2, then add row 3.



5. Repeat Steps 1 and 2 to create 4 units.



6. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of four A squares. Place them right sides together with four D squares. Sew on the marked line, then trim the corner ¼" away from the seam. Press towards the A corner. Make 4.



7. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the C squares. Place them right sides together with a D square. Sew on the marked line, trim and press open. Make 8.



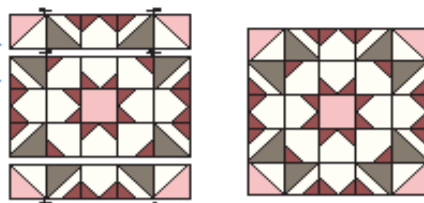
8. Draw a diagonal line on the remaining eight B squares. Place the squares right sides together on the D corner of the Step 7 units. Sew on the marked line, trim and press open.



9. Create units with one Step 5 unit and two Step 8 units. Make 4.



10. Assemble the Shining Star Block as shown. Block will be 10½" x 10½" unfinished.

Materials

Fabrics listed are Confetti Cottons by Riley Blake

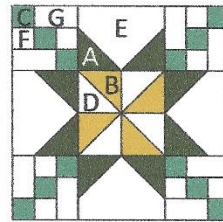
Chive	4" x 21"
Curry	4" x 12"
Lodge Pole	2½" x 21"
Le Creme	6" x WOF

Tools

Marking pencil, scissors, ruler, rotary cutter and mat, iron and ironing board.

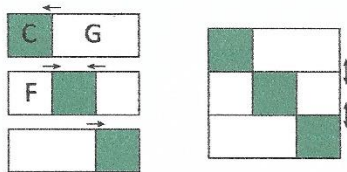
Cutting Instructions

- Chive:** A- eight 2½" squares
Curry: B- four 2½" squares
Lodge Pole: C- twelve 1½" squares
Le Creme: D- four 2½" squares
 E- four 3½" x 4½" rectangles
 F- eight 1½" squares
 G- eight 1½" x 2½" rectangles

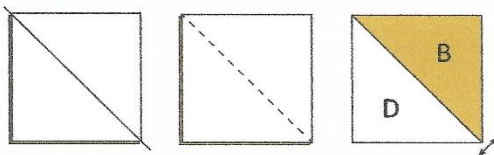


Sewing Instructions

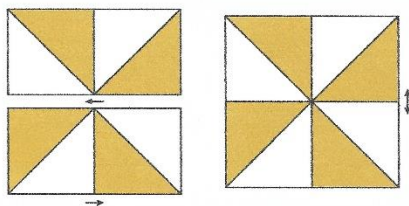
1. Lay out three C squares, two F squares and two G rectangles and sew together in rows. Press toward the dark. Sew rows together. Press seams open. Make 4 Chain Units (3½" x 3½").



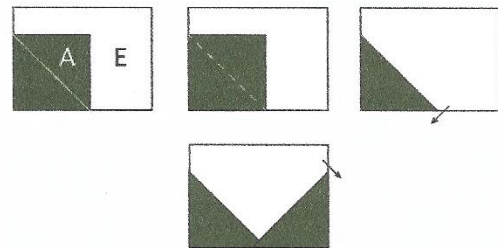
2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the four D squares. Pair with the four B squares, right sides together. Sew ON the diagonal line. Trim ¼" away from the seam. Press seams open.



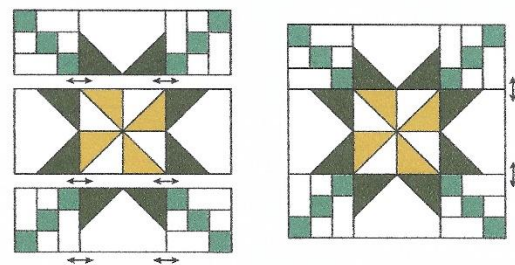
3. Sew the half square triangles in a 4-patch to create a Pinwheel Unit (4½" x 4½").



4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the A squares. Position an A square on the bottom left corner of an E rectangle, right sides together. Sew on the diagonal line. Trim ¼" away from the seam. Press. Repeat with the right side. Make 4 Star Point Units (3½" x 4½").



5. Lay out the quilt block using the four Chain Units, four Star Point Units and one Pinwheel Unit. Sew together in rows. Sew the rows together to complete the Pinwheel Star Block (10½" x 10½"). Press seams open.

WHY DOES IT DO THAT?
