ONGOING PROJECT FOR CHARITY Pattern is on last page.

I am adding another project for you to do at home. This one is for preemie babies. Instructions are on the pattern. They need to be made in pairs.

The 100% cotton flannel scent hearts are given to NICU parents to wear next to their skin, absorbing their scents. The hearts are taken to the NICU and placed next to the infant where they can be soothed by their parent's scent and aid in bonding, even when parents cannot be at the bedside. They are provided in sets of two to allow the hearts to be switched out as needed.

I started tracing out the heart first onto the flannel and then sew it. Then I cut it out and turn. Seems to be smoother edges that way. And I use my walking foot.

Hearts can be turned into Deb Rauseo for washing and arranging dispersion of hearts.

Scent Heart Template

Scent hearts should be from 100% cotton flannel fabric, pre-washed in unscented detergent.

- 1. Use the template below to cut 4 hearts out of the same pattern flannel.
- 2. Place the right sides of 2 hearts together, and sew around the edge ¼ inch seam, leaving a 1.5 inch opening on the lower side of the heart.
- 3. Repeat step 2 to sew together the second heart.
- 4. Turn the hearts right side out and gently iron flat. Sew the openings closed. **
- 5. Each pair of two finished hearts will be individually bagged as a set.
